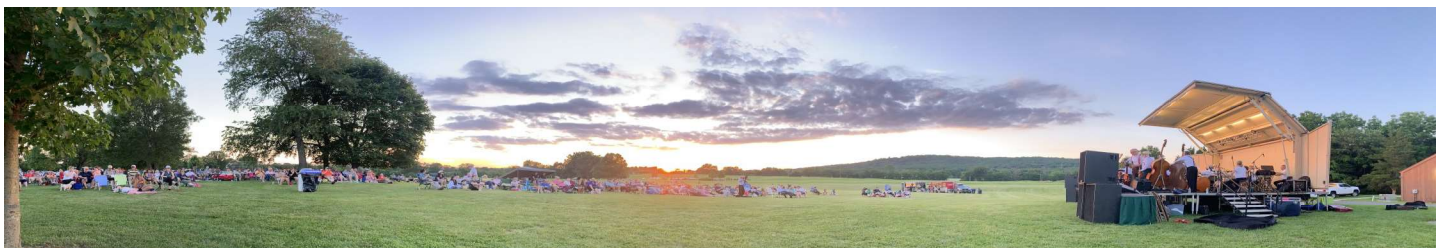
June 27, 2023 - Hunterdon Symphony ~ Forces of Nature

Your leaders will fit you with a lifejacket and paddle, drive to the river, discuss maneuvering techniques and boating safety, and guide you down the river. We paddle for about two hours, stop for lunch, and paddle about two more hours, which depends in part on natural forces, such as wind and water levels. Our aim is to return to Echo Hill by 3:30 PM, give or take an hour.

Treat yourself to a guided evening sunset paddle. The group will meet at Round Valley Reservoir at the boat launch. A short safety talk will be included. Bring a flashlight and an extra jacket; it's cooler by the water when the sun goes down.

Planning your boating trip:

What to wear: We suggest dressing in layers so you can adjust to changing temperatures. Durable old clothes are best; wool keeps you warm even if wet and polypropylene fleece dries quickly. Cotton is a bad material for cool, wet outdoor activities. Sneakers are recommended, please no sandals, boots, or heavy shoes. Wool socks are best for cold weather. A bathing suit may be worn in warm weather, often we stop for a swim.

What to bring: Lunch (in a waterproof container), lots of water to drink, rain jacket, hat, sunscreen, eyeglass strap, etc. In chilly weather, a complete change of clothing may be carried in your canoe (in a waterproof bag) or kept in the van for the trip's end.

What not to bring: No alcoholic beverages are permitted on our trips. No pets are allowed, except service animals. Any valuables that may be damaged or lost in the river should stay at home.

Cancellations: If we cancel the trip, you will be notified by phone and receive a full refund. Our trips run rain or shine with the exception of extreme weather.

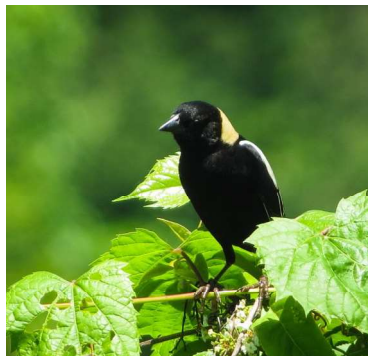

We will take walks around both locations that will probably total more than 2 miles by the end of the day, so please dress accordingly.

Willowwood & Bamboo Brook Parks

This van trip includes a walk among the flowers and unique plants at two Morris County parks: Willowwood Arboretum and Bamboo Brook Outdoor Education Center. You could adventure on your own or with the group. Willowwood encompasses 130 acres of rolling farmland and has about 2,100 kinds of native and exotic plants, many of them rare. In addition to the formal gardens near the residence and undisturbed forest, historic collections include oak, maple, willow, magnolia, lilac, cherry, fir, pine, a superb specimen of a Dawn Redwood, *Metasequoia*, that stands more than 98' tall, masses of ferns, and handsome stands of field and forest wildflowers. Bamboo Brook is located on 670 acres and was once known as Merchiston

Farm and was the home of William and Martha Brookes Hutcheson from 1911 to 1959. Ms. Hutcheson was one of America's first female landscape architects and attended Massachusetts Institute of Technology's School of Architecture and Planning. Her interests included what would become the field of Horticultural Therapy, the use of native plants, and the role of garden clubs in the advancement of civic horticulture. Her design of this garden was completed in the late 1920s, shortly after the publication of her book, *The Spirit of the Garden*, in 1923. Portions of the designed landscape of this garden, including the Coffee Terrace, Circular Pool, and the Upper and Lower Waters have been restored to their circa 1945 appearance with careful attention to the plants used. The gardens are on the National and State Register of Historic Places. Please bring your own lunch and drink, wear sturdy walking shoes, and dress for the weather. We will cover about 3 miles of walking throughout the day. This trip is rain or shine; a light rain will not cancel the trip.

State Kestrel Study Observance

Students will get to observe a State Naturalist as they survey a Kestrel Box on the County park land. The State Naturalist will be determining clutch size and success rate depending on what stage the mother is at for the breeding cycle.



After the naturalist collects their data, it will be explained to the group and questions can be asked. Students will have to walk from the parking area to the study site in the field. No unregistered siblings can be permitted for this class.

State Bat Survey Observance

Wednesday, July 17, 8:00 PM to 9:30 PM

Guest Presenter: MacKenzie Hall, State Biologist

Bats are secretive creatures who prefer to go unnoticed, so they can be challenging to observe and study. A biologist from NJ Fish and Wildlife's Endangered and Nongame Species Program will talk about some bat-focused projects happening in the area and demonstrate how an acoustic detector is set up for passive monitoring. We will then watch bats flying and foraging overhead at dusk while a hand-held bat detector translates their ultrasonic vocalizations into sounds we can hear.



Bluebird House Study

Join us to walk the Arboretum and Echo Hill properties and survey the bluebird houses. Students will learn how to determine which species nested in the boxes and if they had more than one clutch of eggs.
