NJHS Guidelines

Students in Grades 7 and 8 are eligible for NJHS after they have met the following criteria:

- Earned 4 consecutive marking periods of 90 or above in ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies.
- Completed an [application](#) containing evidence of the following information:

CITIZENSHIP:

List all extracurricular activities the student has participated in school or while attending school. Include clubs, sports teams, chorus, band, etc. and any major accomplishments.

LEADERSHIP:

List all elected or appointed leadership positions held in school or community activities. Only those positions in which you were directly responsible for directing or motivating others should be included. For example, elected student body, class, or club officer; committee chairperson; team captain; newspaper editor; or community leader.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: List any community service which you have participated in and note any major accomplishment in each. These should be any service outside of school in which you participated for the betterment of your community. For example: church groups, clubs sponsored outside the school, Boy or Girl Scouts, volunteer groups, or community art endeavors.

Submit an essay discussing one of the pillars of NJHS (Everyday Scholarship, Service, Leadership, Character, and Citizenship).

NJHS induction ceremony will be held in the Spring of 2024.

Throughout the year, NJHS students show a dedication to service projects. Meetings are held once a month.
